## *Golf Course Update*

August was a very hot month for the golf course with above average temperatures prevailing for the majority of the month making it difficult for us to keep up with the isolated dry spots. As a result of this, some areas got a little brown at times and looked as though they were in trouble. But that was not the case as we continued to provide acceptable playing conditions over the majority of the golf course.

Another problem the heat produces is that during these times the putting surfaces become a little dried out, especially in the higher areas of the greens and look like they are getting ready to check out. This was also not the case and fortunately we were able to recognize the problem early and were able to hand water these areas resulting in minimal damage. The bottom line is that we are still getting comments on a daily basis from both members and guest on how nice they are and a lot of people are saying that we still have the best greens in the area.

Unfortunately, we were not able to perform our core aerification during the month of August as our subcontractor had problems with the crew that was supposed to be here and they were a no show on the day it was scheduled. We rescheduled it for a week later and were having so many problems with the irrigation system that we decided not to do it on that day either. Our plans are now to schedule another air aerification over the next few weeks to insure that the greens continue to remain in good shape.

On the bright side, we are pleased to report that the sod work we performed during the early part of the summer is starting to fill in and the new teal tees are also looking good. We expect by the end of the growing season that all of these areas will be completely filled in and the golf course will continue to improve.

## *Never Underestimate The Importance of Your Setup*

To understand why your set up is so important, it's useful to understand a bit about open and closed skills in sport.

An open skill involves variables that are usually beyond your control. Think of a tackle in soccer – you have to react to the movements of other players and a moving ball.

A closed skill on the other hand is controlled purely by you. Think of a free throw in basketball – there are no moving players to contend with, the ball is stationary and there are no real time constraints.

Any sport that is made up of closed skills usually demands you to be very accurate and very consistent (think of darts, pool, shooting etc.).

The golf swing is a closed skill – and one with a very small margin of error. Because of this we have to take every precaution to maximize our accuracy and consistency. The starting point for this consistency is our set up...

By repeating the same set up every time for every shot, we allow our golf swing to develop as quickly and as consistently as possible. Any variation and faults in our golf set up routine will have a detrimental effect on the outcome of each shot.

I would encourage all golfers of any standard to continually focus on a good quality set up. You should pay particular attention to accurate alignment as it's an area I feel many golfers overlook and lack discipline in establishing it as part of their set up routine.

### *Broiled Salmon with Soufflé Topping*

#### **Ingredients**

3/4 cup unsalted butter ` 1 large shallot ~ 2 tablespoons minced fresh tarragon ~ 1 tablespoon dried thyme ~ 1 tablespoon minced fresh dill ~ 2 tablespoons snipped fresh chives ~ 6 salmon filets or steaks

#### **Soufflé Topping**

1 ½ cups mayonnaise ~ 2 tablespoons minced fresh tarragon ~ 1 tablespoon minced fresh dill ~ 2 tablespoons fresh snipped chives ~ 2 egg whites

#### **Soufflé Topping Directions**

In a small bowl combine mayonnaise, tarragon, dill, chives and mix well. Beat egg whites until stiff not dry and fold in mayonnaise mixture.

#### **Directions**

1. Preheat broiler, in a small saucepan melt butter. Add shallots, tarragon dill and chives. Place salmon in a large heat resistant gratin dish and brush fish with herbed butter. Broil until fish is cooked (about 10 minutes) depending on fish thickness.
2. Cover salmon with soufflé topping, broil until puffy and brown. Serves 6
