GOLF NEWS

As most of the golf members know by now, we have limited all non-golf member play to two rounds per month before 1:00. I am frequently asked why the guests can't play more than that because they had a block for four or a block for a group that wasn't full. Since our membership is full, there are some golf members that are unable to play golf at their desired times. This policy has shrunk the number of players in a lot of the groups and I am monitoring this and adjusting the tee sheet to allow other members to play. Not all these new openings are available on our website. So, if you are a golf member keep your carts out of the roughs as much and want to play on Saturday or Sunday morning and don't see a time, call the golf shop and ask because there is a chance we can get you on the course in one of these openings. Lastly, please do your best to go online or call us if you are going to have fewer players than you are booked for. This will help other members who can't find a tee time get access to the course closer to the time they want to play.

Last month we had our Christmas Shamble with 40 golfers, 12 more than last year. COURSE NEWS

Green Side UP

Our version of winter is here. Grass growth has come to a standstill, so we're doing the usual winter stuff. We have begun trimming palms going from 18 backwards. For those who don't know, we work in front of golfers in the morning and typically work backwards after that so we don't keep running into the same people. The butterfly garden is finally in except for some additional host plants alongside the putting green. We will be dressing up some landscaping around the tee areas soon. We have managed to eliminate a lot of the weeds on the tee boxes. That has left some bare spots on many of the tees so we have begun plugging these bare spots with grass from our sod nursery.

I've had people asking why we quit putting sand buckets on the par 3 tees. Simply put, there's less agronomic benefit to doing so. Paspalum primarily grows from the bottom up, as opposed to the top lateral growth you see in Bermuda grass. Leveling Bermuda divots shortens the growth from point A to B. Filling individual divots on Paspalum tees creates an unlevel surface that requires us to level and regrass every 5 to 10 years. Leveling divots in fairways is still desirable for playability to keep balls from settling in the bottom of divots.








In Memory of Member Clare McCreary
